

# Present Simple

HELPFUL HINT

S + verb + object ...

I/we/they/you + like + tea.  
He/she/it + likes + tea.

Use it for ...

- \* Facts.
- \* Habitual actions.
- \* Things that don't/won't change.
- \* Describing yourself.

S + don't/doesn't + verb + object ...

I + don't + like + tea.  
She + doesn't + like + tea.

Signal words

- Adverbs of frequency, like:
- \* Often
  - \* Usually
  - \* Sometimes
  - \* Never

Do/Does + S + verb + object?

Do + you/we/they/I + like + tea?  
Does + he/she/it + like + tea?

BUT REMEMBER



\*\*\* The verb 'to be' is different \*\*\*

I + am (Australian.)  
He/she/it + is (clever.)  
you/we/they + are (nice.)

A present simple tense is a verb form of a sentence that tells about the action, circumstance which happens regularly, or occurrences.



**Subject + verb (s/es) + object**

Romie loves to eat burgers.



**Subject + do/does + not + verb + object**

Romie does not love to eat burgers.



**Do/does + subject + verb + object + ?**

Does Romie love to eat burgers?
